**We are grateful to Dr Donald Sinclair and Ryder Cheshire Australia for having invited Raphael to be part of the recent Biennial Conference held at Ballarat.**

Vice Admiral Koppikar has returned with glowing accounts of the depth of discussions and Ballarat Support Group's organizational achievements. But it is Ballarat's school children and their sensitivity towards those suffering that had him bowled over!

It is with considerable satisfaction that we in Raphael have received the news that the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities received its 20th Ratification on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2008, triggering its and the Optional Protocol's entry into force thirty days later. India signed the Conventional on 30th March 2007 and ratified it on 1st October 2007. **This marks a major milestone in the international effort to promote, protect and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedom of persons with disabilities, and to promote respect for their inherent dignity.**

I do hope that many of Raphael's friends are planning to join us for the **Golden Jubilee Founders Day in 2009**. This will be one way of commemorating the vision of our Founders and the support of all those who made their vision turn to reality.

## NEWS FROM TIMOR-LESTE

One of the most rewarding aspects of humanitarian work is to see a dream become a reality.

That is exactly what has happened at Klibur Domin - from the dream of late 1999 when the Foundation knew that

somehow it wanted to assist the people of East Timor, to the mature home of today helping hundreds of sick and disabled people every year.

My first visit to East Timor in May 2000 revealed a totally demoralized population, traumatized by the events of September 1999 following the Referendum of 30 August. Most people were only surviving because of food handouts from the UN and other Non Government Organisations. They were sheltering under primitive circumstances, often with just a few sheets of burnt galvanized iron to keep them dry during the wet season. With more than 80% of all buildings in the country torched by the retreating militia forces and Indonesian Armed Forces, the infrastructure was largely destroyed.

The buildings at Klibur Domin were not torched in 1999 but they were ransacked and looted and they needed a lot of work to make them habitable. The 18 residents and 15 staff who remained at the home from Indonesian days were living in deplorable conditions and on meagre food handouts. The job in front of the Foundation was huge.

So what a delight it was on my most recent visit in August this year to find a totally different picture. Most of the buildings had been largely restored and now there are nearly sixty residents and patients living in comfortable circumstances and receiving excellent care from a staff of 23 dedicated East Timorese plus several Australian volunteers. Along the way, some 120 volunteers mostly from Australia have contributed to the development and the operation of the home – a truly remarkable effort when you consider that these volunteers have received no remuneration, allowances or travel cost reimbursement from Ryder-Cheshire.

During my week in East Timor I saw several new programs. Driving by 4WD to a remote village, I met Jito a 15 year old with paraplegia who has been under the care of the Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) team from Klibur Domin for more than a year. Jito is now able to attend school using a new wheelchair provided by the team. A ramp constructed at his house means that he is far more mobile and independent. He has been transformed from an unhappy young man lying around his home to a confident and happy student with a future.

Several hundred metres away, I met Jacinta, an 11 year old girl with

Cerebral Palsy who was also receiving support and physiotherapy from the team.

Jacinta will probably never go to school but her life has been made far more comfortable through the support of the team for her and her family.

Jito and Jacinta's village of about 400 people had been without water for more than six months when a 500 metre section of pipe was washed away. Families were carrying water for several hours a day, just to survive. This problem will soon be fixed with a grant of about \$3000 from the Foundation.

On another day, I went on a two hour drive up into the mountains to watch the Mobile TB Team at work. I was most impressed with the professional and thorough approach of the Team which has checked more than 24,000 people in surrounding villages for Tuberculosis over the past two years. These checks found 235 confirmed cases which have been treated or are under treatment.

With a TB rate of around 1% of the population, East Timor has a major problem controlling this life threatening disease. Klibur Domin is leading the way with its Mobile TB Team and with its new isolation ward to treat Multi Drug Resistant TB, the most virulent form of the disease. While the ward had started with just two patients at the time, many more cases will be detected and Klibur Domin is the only facility providing long term treatment of MDRTB.

In January 2000, the Foundation brought the 13 year old Isaura da Silva to Melbourne for life saving heart surgery. She returned to Melbourne in 2006 for further surgery. I visited the 21 year old Isaura at her home in Dili and found a delightful young lady, still with a beautiful smile. We will continue to monitor her health and assist her when needed.

As always Joaquim, the Home Manager, is full of energy and enthusiasm and he has many more projects he wants to implement. On top of the list is a Respite Centre so the likes of Jito and Jacinta and their families can come to Klibur Domin for a few weeks for intensive therapy, healthy nutrition and a relaxing environment. With some 60 children on the CBR program, the Respite Centre will be in strong demand. Joaquim has also been approached to set up a facility for people with mental illness. This is a major project and it will need a lot of planning and funding from the Ministry of Health to reach fruition.

**My message to all our loyal supporters is that Klibur Domin has been transformed into a first class facility where hundreds of people are receiving magnificent care every year. Much can still be done to improve it and to allow it to help even more people who are in desperate need.**

### **Our Founders**

**In this year of 2008, "LEONARD CHESHIRE DISABILITY" is celebrating its DIAMOND ANNIVERSARY.**

It is a time to acknowledge the vision of two very special people who devoted their lives to the care of the suffering and whose work still continues to help thousands of people around the world.

**Sue Ryder** served with the Polish Section of the British Special Operations Executive during World War Two and learned at first hand of the suffering inflicted by that war. After the war she became involved in relief work in Europe and in 1953 established the **Sue Ryder Foundation** to bring help to the broken, the suffering and the dying. She received the OBE in 1957, was appointed CMG in 1976 and in 1978 was created a life peer by Queen Elizabeth the Second, taking the title Baroness Ryder of Warsaw. **Group Captain Leonard Cheshire** was a legendary R.A.F. bomber pilot decorated with the VC OM DSO and DFC. Like Sue Ryder he responded to those in need. He began in his own home in 1948 nursing a man dying of cancer, then became involved in the care of people with disabilities. This was the beginning of the **Foundation of Cheshire Homes**. From England, the Foundation spread throughout the world.

**In 1959 Leonard Cheshire and Sue Ryder married.** They had combined forces in 1958 to establish the **Ryder-Cheshire Foundation**, undertaking projects which did not fall within the scope of their existing foundations. Leonard Cheshire died in 1992. Sue Ryder died in November 2000.
