Disaster Management Workshop held at Raphael

Disability Inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction, commonly known as DIDRR, is a community that strives to reduce the impact of disasters on affected communities by mitigating and reducing risks. The two day mock drill was organized by the Samvedna Project, Landour Community Hospital, Mussoorie (A Unit of Emmanuel Hospital Association) and the government Disaster Management Programme at Raphael on March 9 and 10. An awareness session for all the staff and students included: the correct way to make a call to 108 Emergency and what to do while you wait, how to make a stretcher with available materials, how to give cardiopulmonary resuscitation in case of a heart attack, the Heimlich maneuver, and hazard mapping of




He will be missed for his sincere commitment and care to Raphael. We wish him a well deserved retirement
