OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Of paramount importance to all of us who support the work of the Cheshire Foundations in Australia, is the forthcoming visit of Group Captain Cheshire and his wife, Sue Ryder, in October/November. Details of their itinerary are listed in this Newsletter.

For those who have met this remarkable pair, or heard them speak of their work on a visit here four years ago, this chance to hear of the expansion of the last few years will be greatly welcomed; for those who have supported the movement without having met the founders, the opportunity to hear first-hand accounts of the Foundation's widespread achievements - often in the face of serious difficulties - will be of singular interest.

Secondly, we wish the President of the newly-formed South Australian Foundation, The Honourable Justice Roma Mitchell, and her Committee, every success in the future of the Foundation. Evidence of its strength has already been shown in reports received (detailed elsewhere) and continued growth seems assured judging by present enthusiastic membership.

Thirdly, and as further evidence of expansion, is the Victorian Foundation's decision to assume financial responsibility for a further month's maintenance of 'RAPHAEL', making the commitment four months in all.

HIGHLIGHT OF AN OVERSEAS TRIP

Two of the Victorian Foundation's staunch and active supporters - Dr. and Mrs. W. M. Calanchini - have recently returned from a flying trip abroad, during which time they were entertained by Group-Captain Cheshire at his London flat. The following are extracts from the Sixth Annual Report of the Ryder-Cheshire Foundation (Victoria).

"This has been a year of increased activity in the work of the Foundation, and one in which we have also assumed greater financial responsibility for 'RAPHAEL' in the future. We have remitted \$22,414 during the year, of which \$3,350 represents our first month's maintenance for the year 1970/71.

During this coming year we plan to be responsible for four months' maintenance, an increase of one month in the year. In addition, we shall continue to support the upkeep of the TB Unit, at the cost of \$1,300 per year.

That we are able to fulfil such an important role in the support of 'RAPHAEL' is, of course, due to the magnificent help we receive from individual members, from sponsors and from all the Support Groups. The financial statements give some idea of the success of the work done by the Groups, but those who have contact with them will also tell you of the encouragement we receive from their enthusiasm.

We would like to welcome our new Support Group - Templestowe - which has been associated with us for some years as a sponsor. The Support Groups are: Melbourne, Pentridge, Rispana, Templestowe, Ballarat, Gippsland, Goulburn Valley and Clare.

At 'RAPHAEL' itself, the worrying lack of a proper water supply continues, but we trust this will be eased quickly, once engineering investigations are completed.

Our warmest thanks are due to Indianaid, who sponsor Pamela Holt and Overseas Service Bureau, who sponsor our 2 A.V.A.'s - Anne Young and Robyn Rankin. Needless to say, this is a tremendous help to the finances of 'RAPHAEL', as well as forging a link with other voluntary aid organis-
