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KLIBUR DOMIN

Klibur Domin was established in Timor-Leste (TL) in 2000 by Ryder-Cheshire Australia in response to the humanitarian crisis that followed independence from Indonesia. Klibur Domin (KD) in the local language Tetum means 'sharing with love'.

MISSION

Klibur Domin's mission is the relief of suffering without discrimination by means of a range of programs providing assistance and healthcare, free of charge, to people in dire need.

VOLUNTEERS

Overseas volunteers are welcomed at KD to support the staff in various programs, usually for periods of a few months to a few years. Patients and residents love having people of all ages from overseas to visit and work with them. It is often a life-changing experience for the volunteers.

PROGRAMS

Inpatient Program

Caters for people with low-dependency needs recovering from illnesses or injuries, as well as people from rural areas admitted for respite and rehabilitation. The rehabilitation program offers physio and occupational therapy for people with disabilities and those recovering from accidents and operations.

Outpatient Program

Medical Clinic - provides GP consultation, non-emergency treatments for minor injuries and basic first aid. KD provides emergency transportation when needed.

Dental Clinic - undertakes general check-ups, fillings and extractions where necessary. The dental team visits local primary schools to educate children on oral health and to carry out check-ups and preventative treatments.

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR)

Mobile teams visit villages to identify those with physical and intellectual disabilities. Support for patients and their carers includes education as to how to best assist the children; provision of equipment such as ramps and wheelchairs to aid independence; and assistance with nutrition, clean water and sanitation. Some are admitted to KD for a period of rehabilitation.

Garton Cottage

Garton Cottage provides accommodation and support for 10 young people with disabilities to enable them to complete high school.

Tuberculosis (TB) Program

Mobile TB teams visit and diagnose people in village communities. KD is the leading centre in TL for the treatment of Multi Drug Resistant TB. Some people can be treated in their villages with assistance from trained local volunteers, while others with more complex needs are admitted to KD.
